Our Auskick and Junior teams continue to develop into our stars of the future and represented the club in the best possible way, playing with great sportsmanship and respect. It always great to watch the younger teams in action, uncomplicated games played with enjoyment and enthusiasm. Although some this enthusiasm was beginning to fade during some of the wintery weather, we endured this season.

In our Youth teams, the combined Melville/Winnacott/Bibra Lake, Year 7 team had a challenging initiation, not only did they need to adapt to the changes of the youth competition but also had the added difficulties of adjusting to new teammates. The Year 8's had an outstanding year. After dominating the start of the season, the team was elevated to the Red division, and still managed to finish on top of the ladder. However, the team found the transition challenging, especially in the first few games. Adjusting to the rules, the flow of the game and umpires calling free kicks, we all realised, coaches, parents, and players that a lot happens on a footy field.

Season 2021 was the first time the team had afternoon training sessions with the coaches pleased with the dedication that the players showed to improving their skills and learning the rules and positions of the game. 

nents off the ball. This meant the season was a constant evolution, but to the boy's credit they all bought into the process, and we enjoyed a lot of incredibly good wins, a few of them great comebacks. We finished second on the ladder and only lost four games all season, none of which were easy victories for our opponents.

Most importantly the boys really came together as a team and developed a real belief in themselves and our game plan. Add to that a never say die attitude that would hold us in good stead for the finals. And what a final series it was!

After finishing second to Kwinana in the regular season and splitting our games against them we faced them first up in the semi-finals. After a combative first half that saw both sides play some great football, they got hold of us in the third and we went into the final quarter three goals down.

They then jumped us out of the blocks with the first two goals of the fourth quarter to build a solid lead. But as we had done all season we refused to lay down and fought back hard to bring the deficit back to five points with two minutes to play. With the momentum back in our favour we were able to drive the ball forward and an Archie Tames goal with a minute and a half to play saw us snatch the lead back. Another solid centre square contest saw us gain possession and we were able to hang on for a thrilling win and a trip to the grand final.

There are simply not enough words to describe the effort and contribution of each player, throughout the entire season. I could not be prouder of each one of you for all the effort you gave this season and for the way you came together to learn and to work hard for each other. On top of that you are a terrific bunch and I loved sharing the highs, the lows and the laughs with you across the season. It was a real privilege to coach you and I thoroughly enjoyed it.

Not only did she go out of her way to support me as a new coach so that I didn't have to worry about anything other than training and the games, but she made sure everything just happened like clockwork. #### YEAR 10 COACH REPORT

AS PER PREVIOUS YEARS, OUR PRE-SEASON COMMENCED IN SOME TESTING TEMPERATURES IN MID-FEBRUARY AT WEBBER RESERVE, BUT IT DIDN'T TAKE LONG FOR THE BOYS TO BUILD A SOLID PLATFORM OF FITNESS TO PUNCH OUT THE HOUR-LONG SESSIONS.

We welcomed five new members into the squad in 2021 - Luke Pitman, Bailey Mexsom, Elliot Whittaker, Ky Hehir and Henry Mattner, with all of them settling in quickly and making an immediate impact. A highlight of the pre-season was an afternoon down at Coogee Beach. Whilst it was challenging on the lungs, it ended up being a magnificent team building session with the boys cooling off on the pontoon post-session as the sun set.

The week before the start of our campaign in the Year 10 White division, the team elected its leadership group. We thank Ben Elliott and his deputies, Nathan Martin and Henry Mattner, who performed their roles with passion and energy throughout the season.

First up was Roleystone at Springdale Park. The team simply gelled, in a fantastic start to the season and instant reward for a long pre-season - Kats by 113 points. The next four rounds produced wins against Willetton on Mother's Day by 26 points, Booragoon by 150 points, Rossmoyne by 208 points and then Kardinya by 71 points. Five wins from five games and a healthy percentage of 529% resulted in the team's promotion to the Year 10 Red division for the rest of the season.

The Kats faced off against South Coogee in round six. South Coogee had also won their first five games in the Red division

and were the benchmark of the competition. The team started brightly, but instantly felt the step up in game intensity. Inaccurate kicking allowed South Coogee back into the game before they eventually ran over the Kats by 17 points. The boys were proud of their efforts and took confidence into future games. Typical wintery conditions returned in rounds seven and eight verses Hammond Park and East Fremantle, with the boys recording solid 27 and 3 point victories respectively. The East Fremantle game was our Vice Captain Nathan Martin's 100th game with the Kats, but sadly Nat suffered a season ending Salter Harris Type 3 Femur Fracture that required two pins to assist in the recovery.

With the injury toll mounting, the boys bravely battled on but found the speed and skill of the Applecross boys too strong in the pouring rain in round nine, then bounced back to record a morale boosting win verses Cockburn in round ten by 29 points. This had the team sitting in fourth position with a 3 win:2 loss record after the first five games of the competition. A surprise last minute forfeit by Armadale resulted in the team moving into third place and the dream of playing finals in September was a definite possibility. To guarantee this we needed to win at least two out of the final three games.

The boys struggled early against a phys-

ical Attadale in round 12, however never once considered throwing in the towel. Our rotations were restricted when Hayden Sharpe, who was playing his 50th game, suffered yet another broken wrist. What is it with injuries to our Milestone game players? To the team's credit they outscored Attadale in the last three quarters of the game, but still ended up going down by three goals.

We had a quick turnaround during the next week with our round 13 fixture verses Jandakot on Friday night and wowzers what a game!! A packed ground had the boys pumped for a good showing, knowing a win would keep us in with a chance of playing finals. We were down early, with the Jets guick ruck and midfield division and a clever floating half back that blocked our forward movement dominating play. At quarter time we implemented tagging roles and rotated names on the whiteboard with the immediate impact of crawling back to lead by the barest of margins at the main break. The contest remained tight, but efficient forward movement by the Kats resulted in our lead extending to six points with a quarter to play. Game on in the fourth! Jandakot exploded out of the blocks and bounced out to a two-goal margin. However, the Kats continued to surge and with 90 seconds left in the game, the boys finished a fantastic passage of play on the outer wing to grab the lead by four points. Jandakot won the

resulting centre bounce, and they continued to pepper their goals, but the Kats stood strong to record a memorable 3-point victory. The post-game celebrations were intense, and I have never heard the club song sung with so much passion.

with a superior percentage, the Kats had forced their way back into the top four — we are finals bound for the first time.

Bull Creek Leeming responded in the second with the breeze and both teams went into half time with not a point separating them. Sadly, that's where the dream ended for the Kats with the team unable to kick a "6-pointer" in the second half verses Bull Creek Leeming kicking five. Still the boys played out the game with spirit and pride and will learn from the finals experience.

Congratulations to Alex Ferguson and Hayden Sharpe on playing their 50th game and Nathan Martin, Ben Elliott, Cooper Elliott, Xavier Curr, Elliot Whittaker and Joshua Martin on playing their 100th game of footy throughout the season.

Injuries provide opportunities for other boys to shine, and I wish to acknowledge the Year 9 players that played for the 10's throughout the season — congratulations and thanks Cahil Fitzgerald, Archie Tames, Sam Nelson and Jamie Richardson.

I cannot thank enough the contributions made by my fellow coaches — Tyson Pittard and Rob Martin. Again, it has been a pleasure to collaborate with you and our boys are extremely fortunate to have you guide them in their developing footy careers.

A huge thank you to the best Team Manager in the business, Catherine Elliott. We

all appreciate your ability to manage the team administration so efficiently that enables the team to run so smoothly. To Cameron and Catherine Elliott, I know that I can speak from all the players and families, we all eagerly await your weekly photo slideshow, so again thank you for your contributions.

To our parent group, thank you for all your support and willingness to contribute all season.

Finally, to a super bunch of young men — congratulations on a great season. We are all incredibly proud of the way you have gelled as a team, your work ethic, resilience, skills and the respectful competitiveness you display when-ever you pull on the Kats jumper. Let's go one week deeper in the season in 2022!



#### EAST FREMANTLE FOOTBALL CLUB LYNN MEDAL


